Waardi remains committed to its task

The administration body, Waardi Ltd, will continue its work under the Browse LNG Precinct Project Agreement.

The Agreement was signed in June 2011 by representatives of the Goolarabooloo Jabirr Jabirr (GJJ) Native Title Claim Group.

Waardi Chairperson, Warren Greateorex, said today that the Precinct Project Agreement (the PPA) still stands and there was no change in Waardi's position as a result of the outcome of the claim group meeting yesterday.

"Waardi, as the administration body, is a party to the Agreement," Mr Greateorex said. "We were ratified by the Native Title Party, Woodside and the State in July last year. As such we have responsibilities under the PPA and we will be honouring those commitments.

"Waardi still represents members of the GJJ claim group."

"We will continue to work with other parties to the Agreement to fulfil our responsibilities under the Agreement. As well, we will continue to liaise and build relationships with other major stakeholders such as the State Government, Woodside and members of the GJJ claim group, and our partners in commercial businesses."

Mr Greateorex said Waardi and its entities remained committed to building on the work it had completed to date.

"We will continue to consolidate the foundations for the traditional owners now and into the future," he said. "We are here for the long haul."
