## **Waardi supports application for discontinuing native title claim**

Waardi Limited supports the recent application to the Federal Court for leave to discontinue the Goolarabooloo Jabirr Jabirr Native Title claim.

Waardi Chairperson, Warren Greatorex, said today that a statement by the KLC that Waardi joined the State Government and Woodside in opposing the application was wrong.

“Waardi supports the discontinuance,” Mr Greatorex said. “But Waardi wants to make sure that the Named Applicant, in its capacity as the Native Title Party under the Browse LNG Precinct Project Agreement, deals with the rights and obligations of the Goolarabooloo Jabirr Jabirr group before the granting of a discontinuance.

“Waardi supports the application on the grounds that there are rights and obligations which remain, and benefits which are still owed to the GJJ Group, even after discontinuance.

“As the Administrative Body under the Agreement, Waardi has an obligation to look after those rights and benefits and wants the Native Title Party to address this issue before a discontinuance.

“We want to make sure that the rights and interests of the GJJ Group are looked after. Otherwise there will be major adverse consequences for the Group in terms of their rights under the Browse LNG Precinct Project Agreement.”
